Fresh Water Management in Washington State

Water is . . .

- A public resource
- Used under prior appropriation

Three branches of state law

- Statutes (RCWs)
- Ecology Rules (WACs)
- Court rulings

Ecology currently regulates

- Rulemaking
- Permitting system
- Adjudication . . .



What is an Adjudication?

Only way to identify all legal water users on a source


 Superior Court prioritizes rights from oldest to newest

 Single process for all history, and law of water use

Result = Final Court Decree



Ecology's Recommendation: WRIA 1 - Nooksack



Why is a Nooksack Adjudication Needed?

Records do not reflect use

 Hinders planning, regulation, mitigation, banking and transfer

• All rights are vulnerable

Federal and Tribal rights are not quantified

Only sure way to long-term solutions



How do Adjudications Work?

Sample years based on 2021 start date

- 1. Ecology defines a water source and identifies users (2021-2022)
- Ecology files in Superior Court (2023). Court sets deadlines and process (2023-2024).
- 3. All water users respond with a claim and supporting evidence (2023-2025 or beyond)
- 4. Ecology provides a Report of Findings (2025 or beyond, perhaps in phases, depending on subbasins)
- 5. Water users may object to Ecology or each other (2023 at the earliest)
- 6. Court rules on rights and issues a schedule (10-20 years after filing, possibly in phases)
